GUIDELINES FOR PUBLIC CONDUCT DURING TOWN BOARD MEETINGS

- 1. The Supervisor shall preside at the meetings of the Town Board. In the absence of the Supervisor, the Deputy Supervisor shall be the acting Supervisor. In the event both the Supervisor and the Deputy Supervisor are absent, the other members shall designate one of their members to act as temporary chairman. A majority of the Board shall constitute a quorum for the transaction of business, but a lesser number may adjourn.
- 2. Town residents who wish to speak shall fill out a card at the entrance of the meeting room listing their name, contact information, and the subject matter in which they would like to speak. These cards will be collected prior to the beginning of the Town Board meeting and given to the Town Supervisor or Deputy Supervisor in the absence of the Supervisor.
- 3. Speakers must be recognized by the presiding officer and then proceed to the lectern and state their name and address. They must limit their remarks on official town business to up to three minutes on a given topic and may not yield any remaining time to another speaker. They must address their remarks to the Board as a body and not to any member thereof and not to other members of the audience in the form of a debate.
- 4. Speakers should present their remarks in a courteous manner and may not make disparaging remarks or personal comments about public officials, town residents, or others. All speakers will observe the commonly accepted rules of courtesy, decorum, dignity, and good taste with no cursing, swearing, clapping, booing, finger pointing, bullying, whispering, or talking that disrupts the proceedings of the business of the Town Board.
- 5. Any speaker who disregards the directives of the presiding officer in enforcing the rules, disturbs the peace at a meeting, makes impertinent or slanderous remarks, or generally conducts themselves in an inappropriate manner shall be barred from further participation and will forfeit any balance of time remaining for their comments.
- 6. After a final warning, if a speaker willfully refuses to step down, the Town Supervisor shall contact the appropriate authorities to remove the speaker from the meeting room and to restore order.
- 7. The Town Supervisor, or in their absence the Deputy Supervisor, shall ensure compliance with these rules.

RESOLUTION 68-2024 APRIL 8, 2024

RESOLUTION TO APPROVE PROPOSAL FROM GREENE COUNTY OUTLAWS FOR BASEBALL FIELD LIGHTING INSTALLATION AT CECIL C. HALLOCK MEMORIAL PARK

WHEREAS the Greene County Outlaws have entered into an agreement with the Town of New Baltimore for use of Cecil C. Hallock Memorial Park since 2014 and have presented the Town Board with a proposal to install field lighting for dusk and evening games.

WHEREAS all contractors on this project will file certificates of insurance with the Town Clerk naming the Town of New Baltimore as additional insured.

RESOLVED the Town Board of the Town of New Baltimore approves said proposal at no cost to the Town.

Proposal for Baseball Field Lighting Installation at Cecil C. Hallock Memorial Park

Introduction: We, the Greene County Outlaws Board of Directors, respectfully submit the following proposal for the installation of lighting fixtures at the Cecil C. Hallock Memorial Park (Hallock Park) baseball field. This initiative will not only enhance community engagement and promote physical activity, but also will foster a sense of pride in our area's recreational facilities. Illuminated baseball fields will extend playing hours, safely accommodate evening events, and facilitate local sports, benefiting residents of all ages.

Scope of the Project: We propose the installation of strategically positioned lighting fixtures, designed to evenly illuminate the playing field, spectator areas, and field access points. The lighting design will comply with all existing safety standards. As seen in the accompanying estimate from Stone Creek Electric LLC, four 40-foot wooden poles - donated by Anthony Porter, Chief Operating Officer of Utililine LLC - will be installed outside of the perimeter of the baseball field at Hallock Park. Underground power from the concession stand will be run to all four poles, and each pole will have three lighting fixtures. The fixtures will be angled so as to only illuminate the field, and will not shine outward onto neighboring properties.

To minimize environmental impact and operating costs, we will prioritize energy-efficient lighting solutions, such as LED fixtures. This technology ensures optimal illumination levels while reducing electricity consumption and maintenance requirements.

Total Cost of the Project: Stone Creek Electric LLC will be conducting all of the installation of the lighting at Hallock Park. All labor is being donated, and the estimate for materials will be \$10,900 (please see attached estimate). The Greene County Outlaws will raise these funds through direct fundraising (via grants and individual and/or corporate donations) and there will be no cost whatsoever to the town of New Baltimore. Stone Creek Electric, LLC is a fully licensed and insured electrician company serving Greene & the surrounding counties since 2010 (www.https://stonecreekelectriclic.com).

<u>Timeline of the Project</u>: We propose to begin this project in August 2024, at the close of the spring/summer season and prior to the start of the fall season. This timing will allow for as little disruption to the fields and park as possible. The lighting installation should take a couple of weeks and will be completed by the end of August, at the latest. Regular progress updates will be provided throughout this project to the town board and greater community to ensure full transparency and accountability throughout the process.

<u>Objectives</u>: Installing lighting at Hallock Park will enable evening games and practices, maximizing field utility and better accommodating team schedules. Well-lit fields not only improve visibility, but can help reduce the risk of injury and ensure a safe environment for players and spectators alike. We hope that the increase in possible playing times at Hallock Park will encourage an increased participation in our local travel baseball organization,


promoting physical activity and healthy lifestyles for a greater number of children within our communities.

Despite the new lighting granting us the ability to schedule evening practices and games, we still anticipate that the majority of baseball will occur during daylight hours. At most, we expect to play 75% of our games during the day and possibly 25% of games in the evenings.

<u>Conclusion</u>: For over a decade, the Greene County Outlaws have forged deep roots within New Baltimore, cultivating a strong and enduring connection. As we reminisce about cherished memories on our beloved home field, we eagerly anticipate the bright future ahead, confident in our ability to continue enriching our community for years to come. We encourage an open conversation about this proposal, and will solicit feedback from all relevant stakeholders to ensure that the lighting installation meets community needs and preferences.

The installation of lighting at the Hallock Park baseball field represents an invaluable investment in our community's health, well-being, and recreational infrastructure. We respectfully request the town board's approval of this proposal and support for this initiative, and we look forward to working together to bring this vision to fruition.




