OPENING OF REGULAR MEETING

Deputy Supervisor Ruso opened the meeting at 7:12 PM and the Pledge of Allegiance was said. Also attending Councilmen Briody and Irving, Councilwoman VanEtten, Town Clerk Finke, Tax Collector Jordan, Highway Superintendent Jordan and 14 members of the public who signed the attendance book.

Bid Opening

Councilman Ruso: Let me start the meeting by discussing the bid opening for soliciting bids for a purchase of a used International Truck. Not everybody here knows but one of our plow trucks is kaput and we need to replace it. It was a 1980 Oshkosh; the fact that it made it 36 years is remarkable. Nevertheless we have been seeking out choices and we have a bid.

Greene County EMS

Calls for December were 4, totaling 75 for 2015. There were a total of 67 calls for all of 2014. The projected year-end balance is \$100,000.

County Legislator

I hit the ground running in my newly elected position as County Legislator. Having logged many hours this month, I have been able to meet with the legislative members, the County Administrator, the Director for Economic Development, Tourism, and Planning, the County Treasurer, the Director for Highways, and the Director for Emergency Services. I attended the Organizational Meeting, where I was officially sworn into office, 8 committee meetings, and the regular Legislative meeting. I attended the Fire District No. 1 Commissioner meeting and will be attending the Medway- Grapeville Commissioner meeting tonight. I have received several requests for information from constituents and have responded to all of them. I also successfully assisted the County Administrator in locating and contacting a town resident who they have had trouble contacting in regards to an Emergency Services grant. The standing committees I will serve on include Public Safety, Public Works, County Services, and Government Operations. I have been appointed to the Traffic Safety Board, and will serve on task forces associated with the design/construction of the new Greene County Jail.

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I was able to speak with Gary Harvey (Highways) about the potential of grant opportunities for culvert replacement on County Rt. 61 at Sickles Creek. I will be investigating this further. I also expressed my concern with the scheduled re-paving of that road, putting more stress on top of 2 existing slide areas. I informed the Public Safety Committee of what seems to be an increased frequency of Columbia Memorial Hospital going on diversion, affecting county residents and EMS providers. The legislature had not been made aware of this and the Chairman has requested the President of the hospital to attend our February committee meeting.

Some notable resolutions passed this month include establishing a capital project for the aforementioned communications grant, authorizing municipalities to participate in county highway purchases, replacement of one dump body (highway), purchase of two ¾-ton trucks with plows, purchase of two 1-ton crew cab trucks, and authorizing bid requests for the 2016 household hazardous waste collection day. We also authorized a shared services agreement with NYSDOT, which should help remove procedural obstacles should an emergency arise. This agreement has a limit of \$10,000 for services and/or materials and gives 30 days to settle the details, removing the prior approval need, and is in place without a Governor's Emergency Declaration.

It is a pleasure to serve in this capacity. RESOLVED The Town of New Baltimore hereby specifically acknowledges and adopts the authority granted by General Municipal Law §103 (16) authorizing municipalities, among other things, to make purchases of apparatus, materials, equipment or supplies, or to contract for services related to the installation, maintenance or repair of apparatus, materials, equipment, and supplies, may make such purchases, or may contract for such services related to the installation, maintenance or repair of apparatus, materials, equipment, and supplies, as may be required by such political subdivision or district therein through the use of a contract let by the United States of America or any agency thereof, any state or any other political subdivision or district therein if such contract was let to the lowest responsible bidder or and made available for use by other governmental entities. This is also known as "Piggybacking."

The Town of New Baltimore intends to upgrade the Town Wastewater Treatment Plant (the "WWTP") and the Mill Street Pump Station. The Mill Street Pump Station was improved in 2014 as a first phase of work to ensure the public safety and protect surface waters and the environment. The work at the Mill Street Pump Station was a Type II action under SEQR as it involved maintenance, repair and replacement interior to an existing structure without any ground disturbance. The WWTP is in need of improvements to ensure the public safety and protect surfaces waters and the environment. This work is scheduled to be completed by 2017. A coordinated review has been completed.

Reasons Supporting This Determination:

The Town Board has reviewed the FEAF and the criteria contained in 6 NYCRR §617.7 and has determined that the wastewater improvement project will not have a significant impact on the environment for the following reasons:

As required by §617.7(b), the Town has:

- Considered the Action as defined in subdivisions 617.2(b) and 617.3(g).
- Reviewed the FEAF, the criteria identified in Subdivision (c) of this section and other documentation to identify relevant areas of environmental concern.
- Analyzed the identified relevant areas of environmental concern to determine whether the action will have a significant adverse impact.
- Set forth herein its written Finding of No Significant Environmental Impact

The following indicators of significant adverse impacts on the environment, as listed in 617.7(c)(1), were considered:

1. Will the Proposed Action result in a physical change to the project site?
Small to moderate impact. Construction at the WWTP site will disturb less than 1 acre of land in an area which has previously been disturbed and filled with approximately 7 feet of fill. No ground was disturbed during the update of the Mill Street Pump Station as it was a repair/replacement project and all work was conducted inside the pump station building.
2. Will there be an effect to any unique or unusual land forms found on the site?
No impact. No such land forms exist in the project area.

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3. Will Proposed Action affect any water body designated as protected? (Under Articles 15, 24, 25 of the Environmental Conservation Law, ECL)?
Small to moderate impact. Construction will take place within 300 feet of the Hudson River and NYSDEC and NWI wetlands. This stretch of the Hudson River, as well as associated flood plains, river banks, and wetlands, is considered a NYSDEC Environmental Remediation Site (546031) as a result of PCB contamination from GE in Fort Edward, NY. No waterbodies will be disturbed by the proposed WWTP project.

In accordance with applicable regulations, a Stormwater Pollution Prevention Plan (SWPP) may be prepared and implemented for the construction so as to mitigate potential impacts to surface water quality. Work will be completed under terms of DEC permits (if required) to mitigate the potential environmental impacts.

No impact has been identified.
5. Will Proposed Action affect surface or groundwater quality or quantity?
Small to moderate impact. The action is not expected to affect water quantity, but is expected to have a positive impact on the quality of surface water and groundwater within and downstream of the project area.

No impact has been identified.
7. Will Proposed Action affect air quality?
No impact has been identified.
8. Will Proposed Action affect any threatened or endangered species?
No impact. No rare or state-listed animals or plants, significant communities or other significant habitats are known to occur within the WWTP site.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, by the Town Board of the Town of New Baltimore, Greene County, New York (the "Town") (by the favorable vote of not less than two-thirds of all of the members of the Board) as follows:

SECTION 1. The improvement to the facilities of the Town of New Baltimore Sewer District No. 1, consisting of reconstruction of the Wastewater Treatment Plant, and including land or rights in land, original furnishings, equipment, machinery and apparatus required therefor, is hereby authorized at an estimated maximum cost of \$1,575,804, and said amount is hereby appropriated therefor. It is hereby determined that said purpose is an object or purpose described in subdivision 4 of paragraph a of Section 11 of the Local Finance Law, and that the period of probable usefulness of said purpose is forty years.

SECTION 2. The improvement to the facilities of the Town of New Baltimore Sewer District No. 1, consisting of replacement of equipment, machinery or apparatus in connection with the Wastewater Treatment Plant upgrade, is hereby authorized at an estimated maximum cost of \$803,388, and said amount is hereby appropriated therefor. It is hereby determined that said purpose is an object or purpose described in subdivision 4 of paragraph a of Section 11 of the Local Finance Law, and that the period of probable usefulness of said purpose is thirty years.

SECTION 3. It is hereby determined that the aforesaid purpose constitutes a Type I action as defined under the State Environmental Quality Review Regulations, 6 NYCRR Part 617, which are determined under SEQRA not to have a significant impact on the environment.

SECTION 4. It is hereby determined that the proposed maturity of the obligations authorized by this resolution will be in excess of five years from the original date of issuance of such obligation.

SECTION 5. The Town plans to finance the cost of the purposes described herein by the issuance of serial bonds of the Town in an amount not to exceed \$2,379,192, hereby authorized to be issued therefor pursuant to the Local Finance Law.

SECTION 6. Current funds are not required to be provided prior to the issuance of the bonds authorized by this resolution or any notes issued in anticipation of said bonds.

SECTION 7. The proceeds of the bonds herein authorized and any bond anticipation notes issued in anticipation of said bonds may be applied to reimburse the Town for expenditures made

after the effective date of this resolution for the purpose for which said bonds are authorized. This resolution shall constitute a statement of official intent for purposes of Section 1.150-2 of the Treasury Regulations.

SECTION 8. Each of the bonds authorized by this resolution and any bond anticipation notes issued in anticipation of said bonds, shall contain the recital of validity prescribed by Section 52.00 of the Local Finance Law. The faith and credit of the Town are hereby irrevocably pledged for the payment of the principal of and interest on said bonds as the same respectively become due and payable. An annual appropriation shall be made in each year sufficient to pay the principal of and interest on said bonds becoming due and payable in such year. To the extent not paid from other sources, there shall annually be levied on all the taxable real property of the Town a tax sufficient to pay the principal of and interest on said bonds as the same become due and payable.

SECTION 9. Subject to the terms and contents of this resolution and the Local Finance Law, and pursuant to the provisions of Sections 30.00, 50.00 and 56.00 to 63.00, inclusive, of said Law, the power to authorize bond anticipation notes in anticipation of the issuance of the serial bonds authorized by this resolution and the renewals of said notes and the power to prescribe the terms, form and contents of said serial bonds and said bond anticipation notes (including without limitation the date, denominations, maturities, interest payment dates, consolidation with other issues, and redemption rights), the power to determine to issue said bonds providing for substantially level or declining debt service, and the power to sell and deliver said serial bonds and any bond anticipation notes issued in anticipation of the issuance of such bonds, is hereby delegated to the Town Supervisor, the Chief Fiscal Officer of the Town. The Town Supervisor is hereby authorized to sign any serial bonds issued pursuant to this resolution and any bond anticipation notes issued in anticipation of the issuance of said serial bonds, and the Town Clerk is hereby authorized to affix the corporate seal of the Town to any of said serial bonds or any bond anticipation notes and to attest such seal.

SECTION 10. The Town Supervisor is further authorized to take such actions and execute such documents as may be necessary to ensure the continued status of the interest on the bonds authorized by this resolution, and any notes issued in anticipation thereof, as excludable from gross income for federal income tax purposes pursuant to Section 103 of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended (the "Code") and to designate the bonds authorized by this resolution and any notes issued in anticipation thereof as "qualified tax-exempt bonds" for purposes of Section 265(b)(3)(B)(i) of the Code.

SECTION 11. The Supervisor is further authorized, in his or her discretion, to execute a project financing and loan agreement and any other agreements with the New York State Environmental Facilities Corporation and/or the New York State Department of Environmental Conservation and/or the New York State Department of Health, and amendments thereto, and to take such actions and execute such documents as may be necessary to provide for the financing or refinancing of the specific object or purpose set forth herein, or a portion thereof, by a serial bond and/or bond anticipation note issue of the Town and the sale of such issue or issues to the New York State Environmental Facilities Corporation.

SECTION 12. The validity of said serial bonds or of any bond anticipation notes issued in anticipation of the sale of said serial bonds may be contested only if:

- (1) Such obligations are authorized for an object or purpose for which the Town is not authorized to expend money; or
- (2) The provisions of law which should be complied with at the date of the publication of this resolution are not substantially complied with; and an action, suit or proceeding contesting such validity is commenced within twenty days after the date of such publication; or
- (3) Such obligations are authorized in violation of the provisions of the Constitution of New York.

SECTION 13. The Town Clerk is hereby authorized and directed to publish this resolution, or a summary thereof, together with a notice in substantially the form provided by Section 81.00 of the Local Finance Law, in Catskill Daily Mail, being a newspaper having a general circulation in the Town and hereby designated as the official newspaper of the Town for such publication.
