- HOW TO VOTE**
1. Mark in pen or pencil.
  2. To vote for a candidate whose name is printed on this ballot, make a single cross X mark or a single check / mark in the voting square above the name of the candidate.
  3. To vote for a person whose name is not imprinted on this ballot, write or stamp the name in the blank space which appears at the bottom of the column under the title of the officer.
  4. To vote on a proposed motion or resolution, check / mark in one of the boxes committed to the proposal.
  5. Any other mark or writing, or any assurance made on this ballot outside the voting squares or blank spaces provided, for valid will void this entire ballot.
  6. The ballot of the absentee voter must be postmarked not later than the day before election and received by such board of elections not later than 7 days following the day of election if the ballot are counted.
  7. Do not overvote. If you select a greater number of candidates than there are vacancies to be filled, your ballot will be void for that public office or party position.

6. If you tear, or damage, or wrongly mark this ballot, call the Board of Elections at (518) 719-3550 for instructions on how to obtain a new ballot. Do not attempt to correct mistakes on the ballot by making a separate or cross cuts. Erasures or cross cuts may invalidate all or part of your ballot. Prior to submitting your ballot, if you make a mistake in completing the ballot or wish to change your ballot choices, you may obtain and complete a new ballot. You have a right to a replacement ballot upon return of the original ballot.

**HOW TO RETURN MILITARY BALLOT**

1. After marking the ballot, fold such ballot and enclose it in the envelope bearing the voter's statement, and seal the envelope.
2. Fill in properly the blanks in the Statement and sign your name.
3. Enclose the sealed envelope bearing the Statement in the envelope addressed to the Board of Elections and mail promptly.
4. The ballot of the military voter must be postmarked not later than the day before election and received by the Board of Elections not later than 10 days following the day of election to be cast and counted.

**PROPOSAL NUMBER ONE, AN AMENDMENT**

Amendment to Article 5, section 6 of the Constitution, in relation to additional civil service credit for members of the armed forces of the United States

The proposed amendment would eliminate the requirement that veterans who were disabled in the actual performance of duty in any way be receiving disability payments from the United States Veterans Administration in order to qualify for additional points on a civil service examination for appointment or promotion. Under the proposed amendment, the disability must only be certified to exist by the United States Department of Veterans Affairs. The proposed amendment would also update the reference to the "United States Veterans Administration" to instead refer to the "United States Department of Veterans Affairs" to reflect current federal government structure. Shall the proposed amendment be approved?
