RESOLUTION 116-2017 JUNE 12, 2017

RESOLUTION TO APPROVE EMERGENCY REPAIR OF 1997 INTERNATIONAL

WHEREAS, the Town Board of the Town of New Baltimore adopted a Procurement Policy on January 1, 2017 concerning the procurement of goods and services.

WHEREAS, Highway Superintendent Denis Jordan determined that the fuel tank on the 1997 International needed to be replaced before it leaked and Ben Funk, Inc. was contacted to make the repair.

WHEREAS, due to the emergency condition of this repair and according to Procurement Policy 6 b, Section 103 (4) of the General Municipal Law, this service had to be performed immediately and an alternative proposal might threaten the life, health, safety or welfare of the residents.

BE IT RESOLVED, that the Town Board of the Town of New Baltimore approves said emergency repair by Ben Funk, Inc.; Invoice Nos. T471225, T471320, T472139, Credit Invoice T472201; Purchase Order No. H-2017-119, Town Voucher No. 2017-06-50.

RESOLUTION 117-2017 JUNE 12, 2017

RESOLUTION ESTABLISHING ENERGY BENCHMARKING POLICY REQUIREMENTS FOR CERTAIN MUNICIPAL BUILDINGS IN THE NAME OF THE TOWN OF NEW BALTIMORE

WHEREAS, buildings are the single largest user of energy in the State of New York, and the poorest performing buildings typically use several times the energy of the highest performing buildings, for the exact same building use; and

WHEREAS, this Local Policy will use Building Energy Benchmarking to promote the public health, safety, and welfare by making available good, actionable information on municipal building energy use to help identify opportunities to cut costs and reduce pollution in the Town of New Baltimore; and

WHEREAS, collecting, reporting, and sharing Building Energy Benchmarking on a regular basis allows municipal officials and the public to understand the energy performance of municipal buildings relative to similar buildings nationwide; and

WHEREAS, equipped with this information the Town of New Baltimore will be able to make smarter, more cost-effective operational and capital investment decisions, reward efficiency, and drive widespread, continuous improvement.

WHEREAS, the following definitions will apply:

- (1) "Benchmarking Information" shall mean information generated by ENERGY STAR Portfolio Manager, the internet-based tool developed and maintained by the United States Environmental Protection Agency to track and assess the relative Energy performance of buildings nationwide, or successor or herein defined including descriptive information about the physical building and its operational characteristics.
- (2) "Building Energy Benchmarking" shall mean the process of measuring a building's Energy use, tracking that use over time, and comparing performance to similar buildings.
- (3) "Covered Municipal Building" shall mean a building or facility that is owned or occupied by the Town of New Baltimore that is 1,000 square feet or larger in size.
- (4) "Energy" shall mean electricity, natural gas, steam, hot or chilled water, fuel oil, or other product for use in a building, or renewable on-site electricity generation, for purposes of providing heating, cooling, lighting, water heating, or for powering or fueling other end-uses in the building and related facilities, as reflected in Utility bills or other documentation of actual Energy use.
- (5) "Energy Performance Score" shall mean the numeric rating generated by Portfolio Manager that compares the Energy usage of the building to that of similar buildings.

- (6) "Energy Use Intensity (EUI)" shall mean the kBTUs (1,000 British Thermal Units) used per square foot of gross floor area.
- (7) "Gross Floor Area" shall mean the total number of enclosed square feet measured between the exterior surfaces of the fixed walls within any structure used or intended for supporting or sheltering any use or occupancy.
- (8) Town Board shall mean the Town Board of the Town of New Baltimore.
- (9) "Utility" shall mean an entity that distributes and sells Energy to Covered Municipal Buildings.
- (10) "Weather Normalized Site EUI" shall mean the amount of Energy that would have been used by a property under 30-year average temperatures, accounting for the difference between average temperatures and yearly fluctuations; and

WHEREAS, this Local Policy is applicable to all Covered Municipal Buildings as defined in item 3 above of this Local Policy; and

WHEREAS, the Town Board may exempt a particular Covered Municipal Building from the benchmarking requirement if the Town Board determines that it has characteristics that make benchmarking impractical; and

WHEREAS, no later than August 1, 2017, and each year thereafter, the Supervisor or his or her designee shall enter into Portfolio Manager the total Energy consumed by each Covered Municipal Building, along with all other descriptive information required by Portfolio Manager for the previous fiscal year; and

WHEREAS, for new Covered Municipal Buildings that have not accumulated 12 months of Energy use data by the first applicable date following occupancy for inputting Energy use into Portfolio Manager, the Supervisor or his or her designee shall begin inputting data in the following year; and

WHEREAS, the Town Board shall make available to the public on the internet Benchmarking Information for the previous fiscal year;

(a) no later than September 1, 2017, and each year thereafter for Covered Municipal Buildings; and

WHEREAS, the Town Board shall make available to the public on the internet and update at least annually, the following Benchmarking Information:

(a) Summary statistics on Energy consumption for Covered Municipal Buildings derived from aggregation of Benchmarking Information; and

(b) For each Covered Municipal Building individually:

(i) The status of compliance with the requirements of this Local Policy; and

(ii) The building address, primary use type, and gross floor area; and

(iii) Annual summary statistics, including site EUI, Weather Normalized Source EUI, annual GHG emissions, and an Energy Performance Score where available and

(iv) A comparison of the annual summary statistics (as required by this Local Policy) across fiscal years for all years since annual reporting under this Local Policy has been required for said building; and

WHEREAS, the Town Board shall maintain records as necessary for carrying out the purposes of this Local Policy, including but not limited to Energy bills and other documents received from tenants and/or Utilities. Such records shall be preserved by the Town Board for a period of three (3) years; and

WHEREAS, the Supervisor or his or her designee shall be the Administrator of this Local Policy; and

WHEREAS, the Administrator of this Local Policy may promulgate procedures necessary for the administration of the requirements of this Local Policy; and

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED THAT within sixty days after the start of the fiscal year, the Administrator of the Benchmarking Policy shall submit a report to the Town Board including but not limited to summary statistics on Energy consumption for Covered Municipal Buildings derived from aggregation of Benchmarking Information, a list of all Covered Municipal Buildings identifying each Covered Municipal Building that the Town Board determined to be exempt from the benchmarking requirements and the reason for the exemption, and the status of compliance with the requirements of this Local Policy; and

BE IT ALSO RESOLVED THAT this Local Policy shall be effective immediately upon adoption by the Town Board.

RESOLUTION TO ADOPT NEW YORK STATE UNIFIED SOLAR PERMIT AND GRANT APPLICATION
